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



#### IRENE



# **TASTE OF TUDOR HOUSE**



GREEN TEA SODA 8 bags green tea 4 cups boiling water 3 Tbsp Splenda Jackett Family

4 cups fresh fruit of your choice (orange slices, blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, banana slices) I L plain or flavored sparkling water

Add tea bags to boiling water and steep for 2 to 3 minutes. Remove tea bags. Cover and chill tea. Before serving, add Splenda. Add fruit and ice to 8 to 12 large glasses and fill halfway with tea. Fill the rest of the way with sparkling water. You may need to serve with a fork. Makes a refreshing healthy snack/beverage.
