

UNIVERSAL FALLS PRECAUTION LOGO

If you see this logo in a Resident room Tudor House has completed a fall risk assessment and an individualized care plan has been implemented to mitigate the risk.

Some general tips include:

- Call bell within reach
- Bed in low position (brakes locked)
- Lighting appropriate to resident needs
- Good fitting, non-slip, enclosed footwear/pillow paw socks
- Urinal/bedpan/commode within reach/at bedside
- Furniture positioned to facilitate safe resident access
- Ambulating device close to resident (brakes on)

Pillow Paws Socks

Socks that have grip on the bottom and fits under normal footwear. The socks prevents residents from slipping or falling.


Medication Management Standards for Community Based Organizations






